

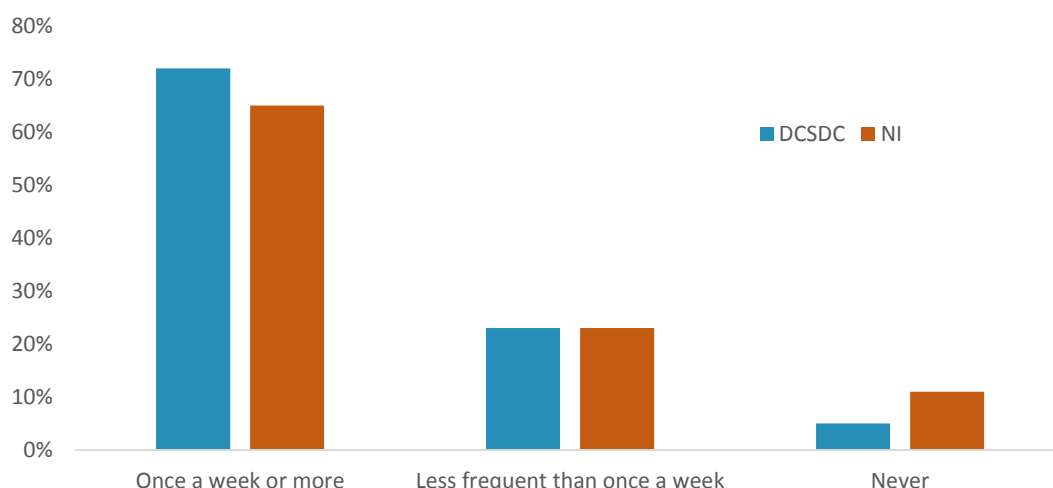
## Culture, Arts and Leisure

**Table 1: Persons spending leisure time outdoors for those in DCSDC and NI, 2014/15 to 2015/16**

|                                | DCSDC | NI  |

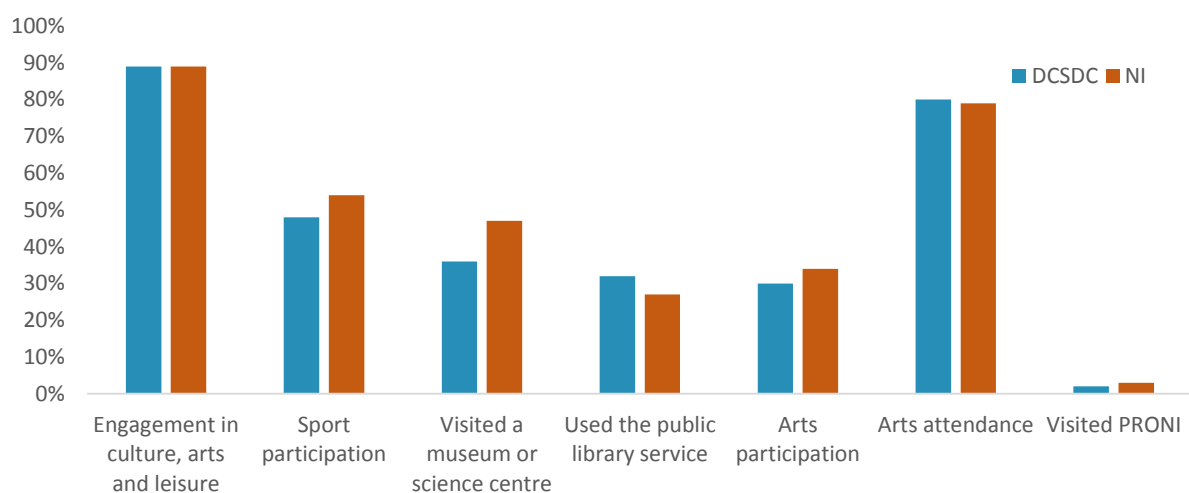
- 72% of respondents to the Continuous Household Survey for the combined years of 2014/15 and 2015/16 stated that they spent leisure time outdoors once a week or more (comparative figure for NI is 65%) whilst 23% stated that they spent leisure time outdoors less than once a week (comparative figure for NI is 23%). 5% stated that they never spent leisure time outdoors (comparative figure for NI is 11%).

- **89%** of respondents to the Continuous Household Survey in DCSDC stated they had engaged in culture, arts and leisure and this was no different to the rest of NI (**89%**)
- **48%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had participated in sports and this was lower than the rest of NI (**54%**)

- **36%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had visited a museum or science centre and this was no different to the rest of NI (**47%**)
- **32%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had used the public library service and this was higher than the rest of NI (**27%**)
- **30%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had participated in arts and this was no different to the rest of NI (**34%**)
- **80%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had attended arts events and this was no different to the rest of NI (**79%**)
- **2%** of respondents in DCSDC stated that they had visited PRONI and this was no different to the rest of NI (**3%**)

The calculation of the cultural deprivation index follows a similar methodology to that used in the proximity to services domain of the MDM. In the cultural deprivation index SOA's are ranked on proximity to sports facilities, arts venues, libraries and museums. An overall index is provided for all 4 types of culture, arts and leisure facilities.

Table 3 above includes only those DCSDC SOA's which fall into the top 10% and 11-20% deprived SOA's in Northern Ireland. The most culturally deprived area tend to be rural areas.
