



An opinion is sought from DCMS on the eligibility of the joint bid from Belfast City Council and Derry and Strabane District Council (Belfast Derry) to host the European Capital of Culture 2023.

Belfast Derry have considered the European Capitals of Culture 2020-2033 Guide for Cities preparing to bid; Rules of Procedure — Competition for the 2023 European Capital of Culture title in the UK; and Call for Submission of applications for the Union action 'European Capital of Culture' for the year 2023 in the United Kingdom. Having reviewed this information Belfast Derry requires further clarification on the guidance "the title applies to a city. Cities may involve their surrounding areas if they wish so, but the title is awarded only to the city itself and not to the whole area. Therefore, where a city involves its surrounding area, the application shall be made under the name of the city.

Will a two city bid be considered eligible on the basis that:

- One of the Councils agree to the application signatory and be the lead city for accountability and responsibility;
- The two Councils are producing a joint and integrated cultural strategy;
- It is one project, which happens to have venues across two cities?

Belfast Derry has also reviewed the cities that competed for the 2020 title in Ireland and note a precedent has been established for a multiple city bid for the title of European Capital of Culture. For the 2020 title, Waterford City Council lead a joint bid on behalf of two other cities, namely Wexford and Kilkenny under the brand of the Three Sisters. This bid progressed to stage 2 of the competition and was commended for the collaboration across the three cities.

Thank you for your letter of 7 July seeking clarification on the eligibility of a joint bid from Belfast City Council and Derry and Strabane District Council (known as Belfast Derry) to host European Capital of Culture 2023. I have consulted with Sylvain Pasqua at the European Commission and have copied him into this reply.

As you have highlighted, the Call for Submissions published in December specifies that "the title applies to a city. Cities may involve their surrounding areas if they wish so, but the title is awarded only to the city itself and not to the whole area. Therefore, where a city involves its surrounding area, the application shall be made under the name of the city." This specification is the transposition of Article 3(1) and Article 11(4) of Decision 445/2014/EU of the EP and the Council governing the ECOC action 2020-2033.

Our understanding is that it will not therefore possible for Belfast Derry to bid jointly in the manner you propose; instead, one area must take the lead. If successful, the lead city will hold the title of European Capital of Culture and, if eligible, receive the Melina Mercouri prize. However, the city's bid and its proposed programme may be dispersed across a much wider area and indeed this is now common practice. For example, Galway's successful bid incorporated a much wider hinterland, and included also some cooperation with Dublin (<a href="http://galway2020.ie/en/about/galway-2020-bid-book/">http://galway2020.ie/en/about/galway-2020-bid-book/</a>).

As you correctly note, the 2020 bid by Waterford City Council was in cooperation with two other cities, Kilkenny and Wexford. However, had the bid been successful, our understanding is the title would have been awarded to Waterford only, under the name "Waterford for the three Sisters 2020". The partner cities would not have been able to present themselves as "Kilkenny 2020", "Wexford 2020" or even as "Three Sisters 2020".

Finally, you asked about Brexit negotiations. As explained in my email of 20 July, information governing the European Capital of Culture 2023 is outlined in Decision No 445/2014/EU and therefore I have consulted with Sylvain Pasqua at the European Commission before responding to your queries.

Youth, Sport and Culture, has expressed doubts on whether Derry City & Strabane District may be treated as a surrounding area to Belfast (or vice versa) as required by the competition rules. He has forwarded your query to colleagues in his DG's legal unit and expects to have their feedback next week.

has considered the examples you offered regarding Waterford and Klaipéda and advise the circumstances are different and not a precedent for your proposed approach. In both cases, cities from the same area were working closely together. In the case of Waterford for the Three Sisters, the bid was instrumental in pioneering a new model of culture-led regional partnership underpinned by a regional cultural strategy based on sharing resources and coordinating programming. In the case of Klaipeda, there was a clear bid leader which intended to involve the other two cities from the same Western Region of Lithuania in order to remove administrative boundaries and to make the region one cultural area and one centre for cultural meetings.

### **Dear Bidding Cities**

I'm sure you are all very busy working on your ECoC 2023 bid documents. I just wanted to send you an email reminding you of a couple of things.

As you know, bids must be submitted to this email address no later than Friday 27 October. Please aim to email them by midday, and keep it to one single file no greater than 5MB in size. This is important as we need to email them to panel members. As per the 'Call for Submission' bids should not exceed 80 pages in A4 format. The approach adopted for the UK City of Culture competition is standard size margins, 12 pitch font and no less than 1.15 line spacing size, you may wish to follow this approach.

20 paper copies should be posted to me at DCMS, Cultural Cities Team, 4th Floor, 100 Parliament Street, London, SW1A 2BQ. Please can you arrange for these to be delivered by noon on Monday 30 October.

I thought it would also be helpful just to share with you some answers to questions recently received.
