The decisions to build Prehen in the way it was done can not be reversed. We can however value and preserve its remaining woodland and adjacent green area. Over recent years 2 further developments have been proceeded despite expressions of concerns of their environmental impact on the area.

At this present time we are told that protection of our environment is a priority for the quality of future life. At a local level this cant just met by planting green areas in the middle of new housing developments but most importantly through the preservation of and limiting the destruction of areas of beauty and established ecosystems. I propose Deer Park Field is one such an area.

It is with anticipation that the council will recognise and value the need to protect areas like Green Park that I express my objection to this area being rezoned for further housing .
