Environmental Information Regulations Request - Historical Flood Data

I refer to your EIR request and respond as follows:

I am researching a parametric flood insurance model for transboundary catchments, with emphasis on the River Foyle at Strabane/Lifford.

1. Could you please provide any available historical flood incident reports, risk assessments, or council minutes related to flooding in the Strabane area?

In particular, I am interested in data on flood extents, dates, response actions, and any recorded river level measurements from the Strabane gauge.

The 'Environmental Health Service' of the 'Health and Community Wellbeing' Directorate of Derry City and Strabane District Council only receive flooding notifications from The Department for Infrastructure for the purposes of administering the 'Scheme of Emergency Financial Assistance' of behalf of the Department for Communities (DFC).

Article 26 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Order 1992(external link opens in a new window / tab) makes provision for a scheme of emergency financial assistance to district councils.

The Scheme enables the Department to reimburse the councils for expenditure incurred as a result of immediate action following a flooding incident. It includes an immediate payment of £1000 to householders as practical assistance to those who have suffered severe inconvenience to help make **homes** habitable as quickly as possible (If household deemed to fit criteria). The current flooding

scheme is from 20 July 2025 to 19 August 2025, and the relevant criteria can be found at the following link.

Below is a summary of the flooding service requests made by householders and received by Council and also figures for those properties which met the criteria and were approved for SEFA payments under the scheme in operation at the time of the flooding incidents.

In Northern Ireland, a single phone number, 0300 2000 100, is used to report all types of flooding, excluding life-threatening emergencies. These reports are collated through the PIPS (Preliminary Incident Reporting System) and managed by WDM on behalf of the Department of Infrastructure. This number is available 24/7 and directs reports to the relevant agencies, such as the Rivers Agency, Roads Service, or NI Water.
