

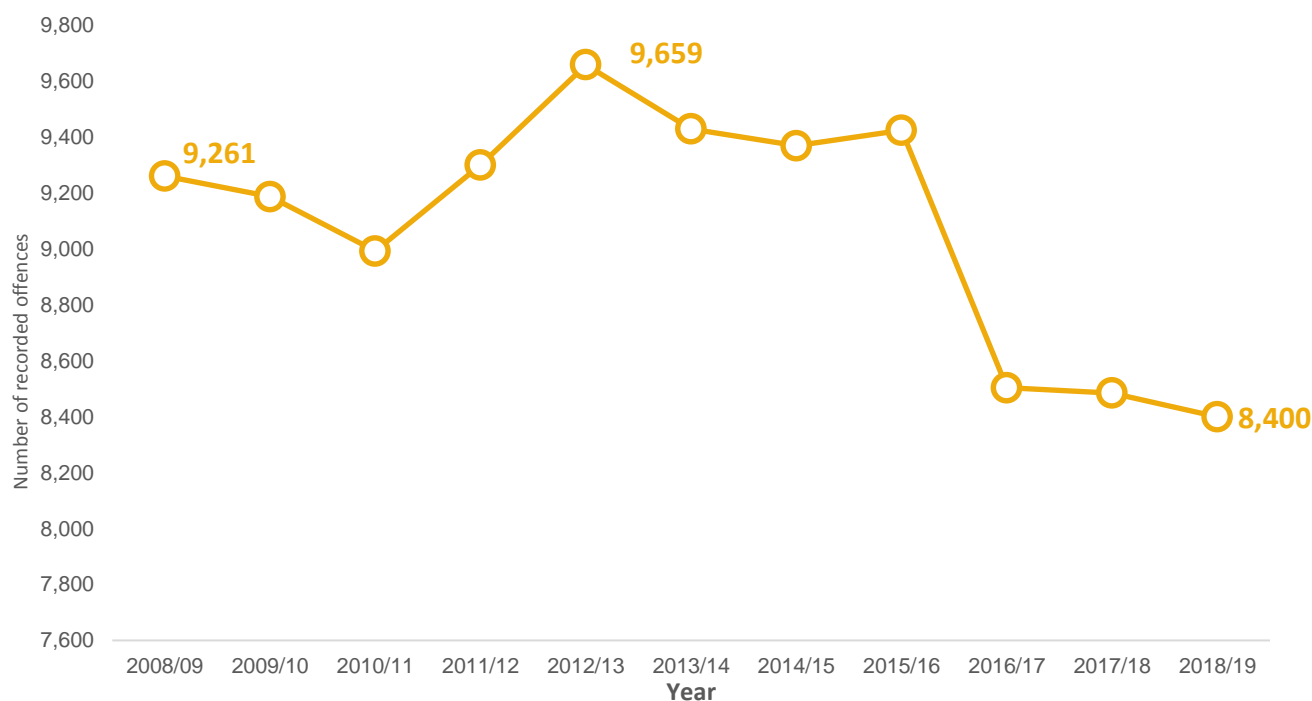

- The number of police recorded crime offences has shown an overall upward trend between 2008/09 and 2015/16 but has lowered slightly since 2016/17.

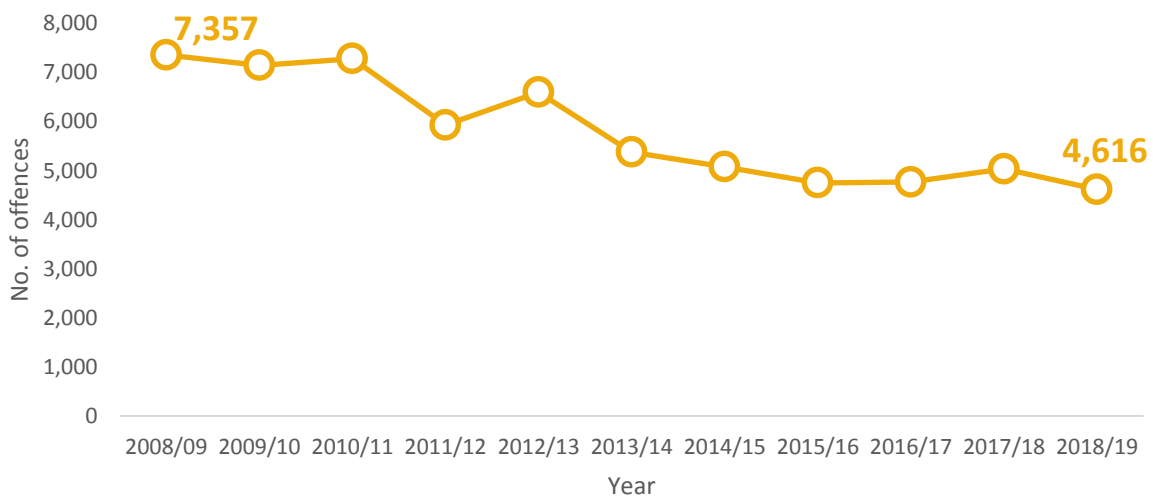

- The number of incidents for anti-social behaviour has generally been declining since 2008/09. In the period 2008/09 to 2016/17, the number of anti-social behaviour offences has fallen by 2,591 but has risen slightly again in 2017/18 to 5,034. The number of incidents for anti-social behaviour for DCSDC was 4,616 in 2018/19.

- There were 3,100 domestic abuse incidents recorded in DCSDC in the year 2018/19.

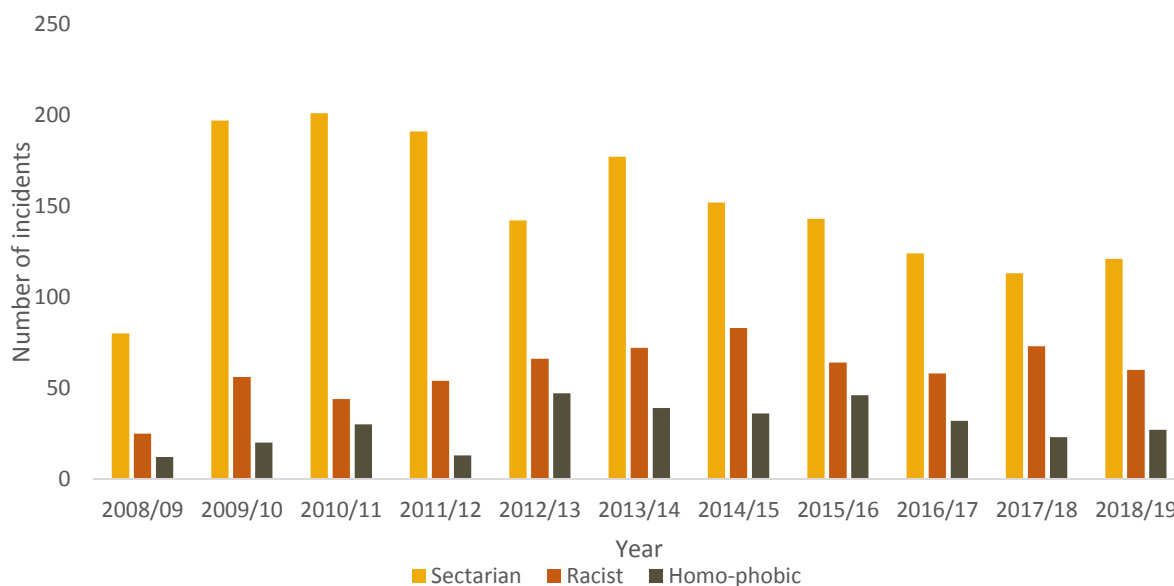

- The largest motivation to result in a hate crime is sectarianism, with 121 incidents in 2018/19. These types of incidents have shown a general fall since 2010/11 when the figure stood at 201.
