## **Bid submitted for £8m PEACEPLUS funding**

PEACEPLUS is a new European Union funding Programme, designed to support peace and prosperity across Northern Ireland and the border counties of Ireland. The new Programme will continue the commitments made by the European Commission, the UK Government and the Irish Government to support peace and reconciliation. The Programme is a funding partnership between the European Union, the Governments of the United Kingdom and Ireland, and the Northern Ireland Executive and will be administered by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB).

Derry City and Strabane District Council and the PEACEPLUS Board have submitted an ambitious bid for €9,254,427 (£8,047,327) of PEACEPLUS funding. The funding is specifically for sustained crosscommunity programmes with 'transformative' reconciliation impact. The bid, which will engage 9255 participants from a wide range of identities across the city and district, was the result of a huge codesign process with local communities.

This magazine sets out further summary information about what is included in the bid. Most of the projects will be advertised by open, competitive tender. # **The Co-Design Process**

A PEACEPLUS Board was set up in March 2022 to manage decision making and processes about the programme. Following on from that, a major Co-Design process was run with local communities. Ultimately, 58 projects have been included in the bid. 50% of these have come forward from within our 8 local growth partnership areas to ensure there is benefit across the geography of our council area. Another 50% are district level projects which operate more thematically across our city and district. The funding criteria from SEUPB (Special EU Programmes Body) was set out in 3 themes: Community Regeneration and Transformation; Thriving and Peaceful Communities; and Celebrating Cultural Diversity.

# **Community Regeneration and Transformation Theme (CRT)**

The Community Regeneration and Transformation Theme makes up 31% of our programmes and includes 13 projects. It will reach 2600 participants. Projects under this theme are designed to empower local people to transform their communities on a cross-community basis. This can include physical appearance and functionality, developing new or re-imaging existing spaces, and must have the potential to create opportunities for an increased level of cross-community interaction.

## Thriving and Peaceful Communities Theme (TPC)

The Thriving and Peaceful Communities Theme makes up 36% of our programmes and includes tendered 24 projects. It will reach 3431 participants. Projects under this theme focus on wellbeing, connectedness and empowerment. They build and sustain relationships between different communities and people; invest in cross-community collaboration to identify issues and opportunities; and develop collaborative projects to bring positive change. Sectoral areas will include children and young people; sport; environment; health and wellbeing; arts and culture; capacity building and community development focused training.

## **Celebrating Cultural Diversity Theme (CCD)**

The Celebrating Cultural Diversity Theme makes up 33% of our programmes and includes 21 tendered projects. It will reach 3224 participants. Projects under this theme focus on providing support to the most marginalized within our communities. This includes migrants, refugees, Irish Travellers, women, the LGBTQ+ community, older people, those living with a disability and those with issues arising from the conflict. Projects will build, improve and sustain relationships; increase knowledge and understanding, incorporate conflict resolution/ more direct reconciliation and good relations work; increase civic participation and engage with those with very diverse views.

The local theme 1.1 bid is only one part of a much larger picture of PEACEPLUS funding. The PEACE PLUS Programme is a €1.2bn investment in the social, economic and environmental development of Northern

Ireland and the border counties of Ireland. It is managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB). It comprises six themes, which encompass 22 individual investment areas.



There are many opportunities for groups to apply for funding across these themes. Of particular interest to local community and voluntary sector groups will be Theme 1.2 'Empowering Communities' where groups will be able to apply directly for small grants of up to  $\leq 100,000$ .
