Tourism Growth Reaches Record Levels

New figures show Derry and Strabane enjoyed a record tourism year in 2025, with almost 400,000 overnight trips generating £93.6 million in visitor spend across the district. Overnight trips increased by 35%, while visitors stayed for more than 1.2 million nights, significantly outperforming the Northern Ireland average.

The growth reflects the area's strong appeal as a destination for culture, events, heritage and short breaks, while continued investment in tourism, hospitality and connectivity is helping attract even more visitors to the region.

The latest NISRA figures for Northern Ireland recorded 5.1 million overnight trips in 2025, with associated expenditure of £1.2 billion across the region.

Mayor's Chosen Charity: Hive Cancer Support

Mayor Grace Uí Niallais has selected Hive Cancer Support as her chosen charity for the year ahead. Formerly known as the Pink Ladies Cancer Support Group, Hive provides personalised support services for individuals and families affected by cancer across the North West, while also delivering cancer awareness and prevention programmes within local communities.

North West Growth Plan and Health Partnership Launched

Political leaders, civic representatives and key stakeholders gathered at Stormont this week for the launch of the revised North West Strategic Growth Plan and the signing of a new cross-border Health Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

The plan sets out a shared vision for a connected, thriving and sustainable North West City Region, with a focus on infrastructure, skills, innovation, health and economic growth. The Health MOU will strengthen cooperation between health services in both jurisdictions to improve outcomes for communities across the region.

Mayor Grace Uí Niallais welcomed the initiative, describing it as a strong demonstration of partnership working and a commitment to delivering meaningful improvements for people across the North West.



Mullenan City Cemetery Now Open

The new Mullenan City Cemetery is now open for burials, providing a modern, accessible and peaceful place of remembrance for families across the city. This £5.2 million investment will serve as the primary burial site for the Derry area, helping to meet the city's future burial needs for many years to come.

Designed with dignity, accessibility and sustainability in mind, the cemetery offers approximately 3,500 burial plots, alongside a range of facilities including ashes plots, a Columbarium, a Garden of Angels, landscaped reflection areas and interdenominational burial provision. The site also features accessible pathways, visitor facilities and ample parking, creating a welcoming and respectful environment for all who visit.

Templemore Redevelopment Plans Open for Consultation

Residents are being encouraged to share their views on plans for a new state-of-the-art leisure and sports complex at Buncrana Road, Derry.

The proposed Templemore Strategic Leisure Project includes a 50-metre swimming pool, family water play facilities, fitness and wellness spaces, sports halls, outdoor pitches, a running track and walking trails.

Mayor Grace Uí Niallais said the project will be a transformative investment in sport, leisure and community wellbeing, and encouraged people to take part in the consultation.

DNA Museum taking shape at Ebrington

Discover the Stories that shaped a city and district.

Work is progressing well on the new £15 million DNA Museum at Ebrington Square, with the landmark attraction on course for completion by Summer 2027. The project is transforming a former military barracks into a modern, inclusive, and sustainable visitor experience that celebrates the people, places and stories of Derry-Londonderry and the wider North-West.

Once open, the museum will explore the region's deep connections to the North Atlantic, telling stories of migration, maritime heritage, and community through six immersive galleries, interactive displays, Archive Discovery Zone, Reading Room, and dedicated genealogy service. Visitors will also be able to enjoy temporary exhibitions and modern learning spaces, along with a café and retail offering.

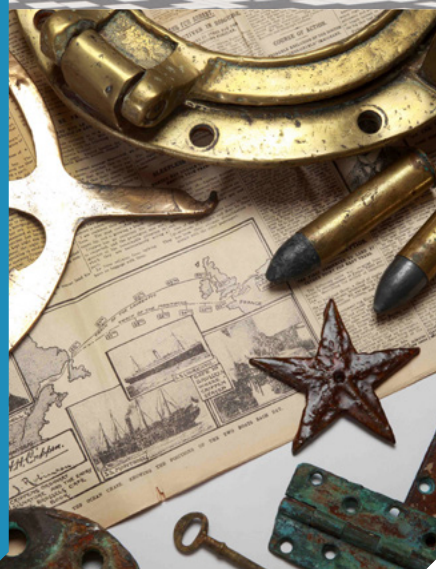
A major focus of the museum will be the preservation and presentation of significant local collections, including artefacts from the internationally important Armada Shipwreck - La Trinidad Valencera exhibition and selected elements of the Story of Derry collection. These treasures are

currently undergoing conservation work to allow these significant objects to be interpreted, displayed and cared for in their new museum home.

The project is being delivered by McKelvey Construction, working alongside TODD Architects and exhibition specialists Tandem to create a world-class cultural attraction that will further enhance Ebrington Square as a vibrant destination for residents and visitors alike. Supported by a range of public and charitable funders, the DNA Museum will provide a lasting legacy, preserving and sharing the stories of the North-West for generations to come.

The project is funded by the NI Executive Inclusive Future Fund, UK Government, The Executive Office, The National Lottery Heritage Fund Department for Communities, Garfield Weston, the Wolfson Foundation, and Derry City and Strabane District Council.

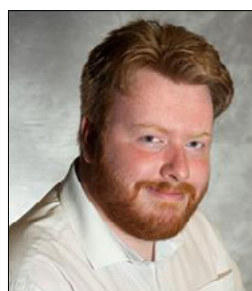
